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OSIG CONDUCTED INDEPENDENT INVESTIGATION OF VIRGINIA PAROLE BOARD

The Virginia Office of the State Inspector General (OSIG) conducted a thorough and independent investigation of allegations involving the Virginia Parole Board (VPB) made through the Fraud, Waste and Abuse Hotline.

OSIG has been made aware by media of information purported to be related to OSIG's investigation of the VPB. OSIG does not have knowledge of specific communications or reports that may be in the possession of the media.

In the course of its investigation, OSIG has made independent findings regarding its investigations after thorough evaluation of the facts and applicable law. For any concluded investigation, including that involving the parole of Vincent Martin, OSIG's independent findings were fully contained in final reports issued by this office.

OSIG has neither officially released, nor authorized the release of, any additional communications or reports to the media or a member of the General Assembly since the final, signed original reports were properly issued last year.

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Established in 2012, the Virginia Office of the State Inspector General manages the State Fraud, Waste and Abuse Hotline; conducts investigations and performance audits of state agencies; provides training and standards for the commonwealth's internal audit programs; and conducts inspections and reviews of Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services-run facilities and programs.
