OSIG Welcomes New Deputy Inspector General



The Virginia Office of the State Inspector General (OSIG) is pleased to announce Corrine A. Louden as the agency's new deputy inspector general. Louden fills the role most recently held by Michael C. Westfall, who was appointed state inspector general by Gov. Ralph Northam in April.

With more than 16 years of state service in the areas of audit, investigations, and financial and operational management, Louden will oversee the State Fraud, Waste and Abuse Hotline and lead the agency's business office and information technology and security services.

Having previously served as a hotline investigations supervisor for the Virginia Department of Corrections, Louden also served as a controller for the Virginia Resources Authority and held audit roles for the Auditor of Public Accounts and Virginia State Police.

"We are thrilled to welcome Corrine to our team," said State Inspector General Westfall. "Her strong audit and investigative background, leadership skills and commitment to excellence make her an exceptional fit for this deputy inspector general position."

She currently serves in leadership roles at both the local and national levels for the Association of Government Accountants, and as treasurer of the Longwood University Alumni Advisory Board.
